



## **Emergency:**

Refugees were relocated from smaller camps. This gave time to plan larger camps built as a second stage. These sites better organised and were had better facilities. By bulding camps with a hierarchy of shelter groupings (cluster-block-sector), it was easier for the humanitarian organisations manage the sites.




Illustration of a block plan for one of hte sites. Cuny Center
